Why 2 creation accounts? A compiler put pieces together. Conservative theologians had no idea why and scrambled to find views that fit 'science'.

They put the fall of Satan between v 1and v 2. \longrightarrow recreating of the earth in verse 3. We don't know when Satan fell: maybe before verse 1. The text does not deal with angels at all.

Earth formless and void : Isa 34.11, in context of judgment, total—> like before creation. Darkness: can be a negative sense. Deep: usually of waters. Here: mass of water.

Moses is setting forth the conditions and when God creates He gives it form and the last 3 days is filling that form: plant, animal, sun etc, animals, man. Darkness isn't just negative.
