To Redeem - ἐξαγοράζω in Gal 3:13

(Ray Mondragon)

I. Usage - Range of Meaning

- A. ἐξαγοράζω occurs 4 times in NT only in Paul, probably as intensified form of ἀγοράζω
 - 1. Christ's Redemption in theological sense

Gal 3:13 Christ **redeemed** us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us-- for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"--

Gal 4:5 in order that He might **redeem** those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons.

- 2. Making the most of Time or Opportunity -
 - Eph 5:16 making the most of your time, because the days are evil.

Col 4:5 Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity.

- B. ἀγοράζω occurs 31 times in NT, main term in word group
 - 1. To Buy in literal commercial sense -> in gospels (21x) always in literal sense
 - a. Food feeding of 5000 Mt 14:15 ...; so send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and **buy** food for themselves." (= Mk 6:36-37, Lk 9:13, Jn 6:5)

woman at well -Jn 4:8 For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.

Passover - Jn 13:29 ..., "**Buy** the things we have need of for the feast"; ...

b. Land - Mt 13:44 ¶ "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in the field, which a man found and hid; and from joy over it he goes and sells all that he has, and **buys** that field.

Lk 14:18 ".... The first one said to him, 'I have bought a piece of land ...

Mt 27:7 ... & with the money **bought** the Potter's Field as a burial place for strangers.

- c. Oxen Lk 14:19 "And another one said, 'I have **bought** five yoke of oxen ...
- d. Pearl Mt 13:46 & upon finding one pearl of great value, he went & sold all that he had, & **bought** it.
- e. Oil Mt 25:9-10 "... go instead to the dealers and **buy** some for yourselves.' "And while they were going away to make the **purchase**, the bridegroom came, ...
- f. Sword Lk 22:36 ..., and let him who has no sword sell his robe and **buy** one.
- g. Linen sheet Mk 15:46 & Joseph bought a linen cloth, took Him down, wrapped Him in the linen cloth, ...
- h. Spices Mk 16:1 ..., and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, **bought** spices, ...
- i. Cargo Rev 18:11 " ... weep & mourn over her, because no one **buys** their cargoes any more;
- j. General Mt 21:12 ¶ And Jesus entered the temple and cast out all those who were **buying** and selling ... (= Mk 11:15, Lk 19:45)

Lk 17:28 "It was the same as happened in the days of Lot: they were eating, they were drinking, they were building; buying, they were selling, they were planting, they were building;

1Co 7:30 ..., as though they did not rejoice; and those who **buy**, as though they did not possess;

Rev 13:17 & he provides that no one should be able to **buy** or to sell, except the one who has the Mark, ...

2. To Buy - in figurative sense -> by Jesus to the church in Laodicea

Rev 3:18 I advise you to buy from Me gold refined by fire, that you may become rich, ...

- 3. To Purchase or Redeem in theological sense -> believers bought by Christ & now his slaves
 - a. Believers 1Co 6:20 For you **have been bought** with a price: therefore glorify God in your body. 1Co 7:23 You **were bought** with a price; do not become slaves of men.

Rev 5:9 ..., "Worthy art Thou to take the book, and to break its seals; for Thou wast slain, and didst **purchase** for God with Thy blood men from every tribe and tongue and people and nation.

- b. False teachers 2Pe 2:1 ..., even denying the Master who **bought** them, bringing swift destruction ...
- c. 144,000 during the great tribulation

Rev 14:3-4 ... who had been **purchased** from the earth. These have been **purchased** from among men as first fruits to God and to the Lamb.

II. The Lexicon Classifications

- A. ἀγοράζω (A&G 12) buy, purchase 1. Literally 2. Buy, acquire as property
- B. ἐξαγοράζω (A&G 271) 1. Redeem, deliver 2. Make the most of time
- C. Others there are other related terms in NT (λυτρόω, 3x) & also in OT (מאל, פדה)

III. The Meaning in Context

Gal 3:13 - in theological intensified sense

believers bought by Christ with the price of His death & now his slaves
